#### Holy Father's intention:

We pray for religious sisters and consecrated women; thanking them for their mission and their courage; may they continue to find new responses to the challenges of our times.

Dear Fathers, Sisters and brethren, Jai Christa!

Thanks to every one of you for sharing my sorrow on the sudden demise of my dear brother Sunny. He was a great benefactor of this mission diocese. Your messages touched me and helped me to accept and cope with the situation. May he rest in Peace.

Some Guidelines for Evangelisation Work in the context of the Anti Conversion Bill: You are aware, the Karnataka Government has passed the Anti-Conversion Bill in the Assembly on 23<sup>rd</sup> December 2021. It is likely to become a Law in the coming days. In the light of this draconic Law, it is very important that we, remaining committed to the Mission of the Lord, plan our activities in this new situation.

We are working in a blessed land in a blessed way. We have experienced the Lord's presence in wonderful ways and there is no question of getting afraid of any force. The Lord is in control of everything around us. We have been working among Christians and people of other faiths whom we are reaching out in a holistic way. By and large, people of all faiths have been appreciating and supporting our work. Yet, as our Lord has said "Be ye wise as serpents and harmless as doves" (Mt 10.16) we need to go on, well aware of the evil growing around us. I request you to keep the following guidelines in mind as you continue ever more zealous in the good work you are doing in the diocese.

<u>In the Institutions:</u> Be Secular in your approach. While having school assembly and public programmes make sure the students/teachers read the Bible and also readings from Scripturs of other religions of the people around. It is also meaningful read from the writings of great Men and Women of all times.

- Establish good rapport with people around. Explain to the Staff, Students and parents of our students about the aims and objectives of the school, especially our efforts of forming young minds as responsible citizens of our Nation that we love as much or more than others do. Include lessons on Constitution for classes IX and above. Have children Clubs/YSM/Youth Groups where children of all faiths work together and take part in debates on issues affecting the peace and justice for all people. Speak to them about Anti-Conversion Bill as well, as a violation of Fundamental Rights.
- On School matters, just say to anyone coming to you to intimidate you: "we take only Official Instructions coming from the Department or our Superiors...you can approach them'. Please do not talk more or get into arguments when people come with an evil intention.

<u>Social Work</u>: Speak to people informally about Anti Conversion Bill and know whether people stand by you. Motivate them to stand for justice and truth when confronted by the Communal elements. Let alone the PRO or SpokesPerson of the organization speak or give the press statement. Please do not argue, or try to convince people who come to trouble you.

#### Faith Formation:

- Please speak to our people about the developments leading to the Anti-conversion bill of the Karnataka Government. Find out whether people are aware of the RSS, Bhajrangdal, Ramsene shakhas that may exist in their village. Make sure people are strong in faith and courageous, faithful to the Lord and the church, ready to face people opposing them while praying. Motivate people to witness and protect the church through Word of God, homily.
- Build up rapport with people, with leaders at the grass root with local, officials such as PDO, Police Sub Inspector, Local *Swamijees*, *Panchayath* Chairman, MLA and others who can help us. Please maintain good relationship with them and don't remain strangers to the people around. Build up relationship even with BJP or RSS activists.
- Remember women can challenge the troubleshooters better. Motivate them.
- Have a Register containing only the names (family wise) of your people, to be shown to people in case any official asks. Tell them that our people have been followers of Jesus for over 100 years. They only change the church and go where their spiritual aspiration are best met. Do not show any other records.

<u>Feast of the Presentation of the Lord 2nd Feb</u>: that occurs forty days after his birth, signifies Jesus the true Light of the World entering the Temple and consecrated to the Lord. It is appropriate that the faithful walk into the church holding lighted candles in a solemn procession welcoming Jesus the Light of the World. Taking inspiration from Simeon and Anna who were present waiting for the Lord's coming for long years and rewarded as the privileged ones to behold him, and also pronounce great prophesies.

We are invited by the church to observe this day as the Day of the Consecrated Men and Women Religious. Holy Father has given the same prayer intention for the month to pray especially for the women religious and consecrated persons. I request the Parish Priests, to observe this day meaningfully with our people praying and felicitating the Religious serving their parishes and missions. My sincere and hearty thanks to all the Religious for their immense service and collaboration in this mission diocese.

<u>Feast of our Lady of Lourdes - Feb 11<sup>th</sup>:</u> Blessed Virgin Mary is specially venerated in honor of her apparitions that occurred in 1858 in the locality of Lourdes in France to Bernadette and her companions. It was at Lourdes that Our Lady called herself "the Immaculate Conception" and gave the world her message that we must repent for our sins. We also celebrate this day as the <u>'World Day of the Sick'</u>. It is a day to offer prayers for the people suffering due to various illnesses. Let's pray for all the sick and old people in our parishes, and also for those who care for them lovingly.

Holy Childhood Sunday falls on 13th February, the second Sunday of the month. To make it a meaningful celebration let us bring our MCA children together and foster in them zeal and love for the mission work of the Church. Let children participate in missionary work through prayer, sacrifices and offerings. We also gratefully remember the Pontifical Society of Holy Childhood supporting all our children Study Homes (hostels) and pray for all people who offer their offerings of love for our children. Let us motivate and invite the children to be 'little missionaries' and also, inspire their parents to stand by them always encouraging and supportive. Please organise a meaningful celebration for the children at your Parish/ Mission centre.

#### Commissions Speak:

Dear Rev. Fathers (Parish Priests/Directors),

SYNOD 2023: We have been organizing Synod consultations in our Parishes and Mission Centers. We have requested the Parish Priests/Mission Directors to synthesize all the Synod consultations of your parish and submit the same to the Deans by 15th March 2022 who will synthesize all the reports from the deanery and submit to the Diocese. The content of the synthesis may be organized according to the following questions, which are offered as suggestions. The aim is to aptly convey the diverse fruits, insights, joys, and challenges of the synod experience and discernment among the people of the diocese:

- 1. In terms of the process of the consultation, what were the main steps taken in the Parish? What were the main questions posed? What was done to engage as many participants as possible and to reach out to the peripheries? Approximately what proportion of people in the Parish/Mission Centre participated in one way or other? Were there any groups of people whose participation was specially noteworthy? Where there specific groups of people who did not participate for any reason?
- 2. What was most significant about the whole experience of the consultation? What were the high points and low points, or the consolations and desolations? What dispositions, attitudes, or feelings were notable? What tensions or disagreements emerged from the listening process? What topics or issues gave rise to diverse points of view? Overall, what were the fruits that the Holy Spirit has brought about through this experience? Among the feedback from the local meetings, what was particularly significant, surprising or unexpected
- 3. Overall, what has the Holy Spirit inspired the community to see regarding the current reality of synodality in the local church, including the present lights and shadows? What did participants have to say about areas where the Church is in need of healing and conversion, in its spiritual life, culture, attitudes, structures, pastoral practices, relationships, and missionary outreach?
- 4. In what ways is the Holy Spirit inviting the local church to grow in synodality?
