Dear Rev Fathers, Sisters and Lay faithful, Jai Christ!

Pastoral Council Members Convention: In view of promoting better participation of our PPC members and other Lay leaders in implementing the Diocesan Pastoral Plan at the parish, deanery and diocesan level, it was decided at the meeting of the Mission Directors and Parish Priests on 17th August to hold the Laity Convention (ಶ್ರೀ ಸಾಮಾನ್ಯರ ಸಮಾವೇಶ) on 5 - 6th August at Don Bosco, Chikpet, Bidar. Most Rev Gerald Isaac Lobo, the Bishop of Udupi with his team has kindly accepted to be the resource team of this Event. The Convention on the theme: 'ಕ್ರಿಸ್ತರ ಅನುಕರಣೆ, ಸೇವೆಗೆ ಪ್ರೇರಣೆ' will begin at 6.00 pm on 5th August and will end 3.30pm on 6th August. I invite all the PPC members of the Mission centers, Parishes, all the Parish Priests, Superiors of the Religious Communities, PPC members, one representative from every village pastoral council (*Gudi Sakmithi*) and any two or three other prominent members in the mission/parish including the Youth to be present for this great event. Let us make sure of the participation of men and women members in equal number. I also request you to pray for the success of this Convention. Similar convention will be held at the Cathedral for the Gulbarga and Vijayapur zone on Sunday 13th August 2023.

2. Parish Support System: You are aware, most of the parishes and mission centres in this diocese are depending on the dioceses for their financial needs. It goes without saying that every parish should aim at being self-supportive. I am glad, some of you parish priests have introduced to the people the practice of paying the 'tithe' and quite a good number of people are responding by contributing generously to the parish maintenance a fixed amount of their income. It is a sign of their gratitude to God for His blessings. I appreciate this kind gesture of the people of paying every month one tenth of their Income. While appreciating such people for believing in the Word of God (Mal 3:10) that ensures abundant blessings for their love offering, please explain to the people the needs of the mission/parishes and persuade them to support the church by contributing a minimum of Rs 500/- as the annual family contribution. Here after, every family shall pay Rs 500/- per annum as the family contribution to the church. The mission directors/parish priests shall also maintain a record of all those who were supported by the church for their studies now holding good jobs and motivate them to sponsor or donate to the church needs generously.

3. Mass offerings by the faithful: Most people in the Parish/Mission Centre in our diocese have not been properly introduced to the practice of offering thanksgiving Mass, Masses for family intentions or for their dear departed family members. We need to teach and motivate people to this practice. To quote some relevant canons:

Can 945.1; In accordance with the approved practice of the church any priest celebrating or concelebrating is permitted to receive an offering to apply the Mass for a specific intention. 945.2 It is recommended earnestly to priests that they celebrate mass for the intention of the Christian faithful especially the needy, even if they have not received an offering

Can 946; the Christian faithful who give an offering to apply the Mass for their intention contribute to the good of the Church and by that offering share its concern to support its ministers. In addition to these, dear priest brothers please read Canon 947- 958 and know for yourself what the church expects from us on the matters concerning Mass offerings and intentions. This will help you to explain to people about Mass offering.

As per the recommendation of the Council of Priests at its last meeting, the Mass offerings have been enhanced to Rs 150 for the daily Mass and Rs 250 for Sunday/Feast days. It is time that we educate the people about this pious practice of Mass offering. Stop announcing several names and their intentions at one celebration. Initiate the practice of announcing the name of the person offering the Mass intention on Sundays and Weekdays. One Mass for one intention shall be the norm.

4. World Youth Day: This year World Youth Day is celebrated with the themes "Mary arose and went with haste" (Lk 1:39). Let us pray for the success of this world event. May all the youth who participate in this unique event experience the Lord's call to serve the church and go forth to serve and become powerful witnesses of the Lord wherever they are.

5. Prison Ministry Sunday

In every Indian state and diocese, the coordinator s of PMI take care of the pastoral needs of Prisoners. Around 8000 PMI volunteers regularly reach out to prisons and through its rehabilitation centres and home for prisoners' children, thousands of our brethren behind bars have been reformed, empowered, rehabilitated, and reintegrated with jobs and settled in families. I thank all the fathers, sisters and lay volunteers for you service. God bless you

6. The Feast of John Mary Vianney, (August 4th) Saint John Vianney was a French Catholic priest who is best known for his dedicated pastoral work in the small village of Ars in France. Despite facing various challenges, he worked tirelessly to minister to the spiritual needs of his parishioners and became renowned for his holiness, asceticism, and ability to bring about conversions. Pope Pius XI canonized John Vianney in 1925, and he was later proclaimed the patron saint of parish priests in 1929. I take this opportunity to wish you all my dear Brother Priests a very Happy Feast of our Patron St. John Marie Vianney. I feel happy to see you my brother priests working with great devotion and commitment in various parishes, missions and institutions, and I believe you carry a great sense of fulfillment. Inspired by St. John Marie Vianney and patron, let us work for our people and pray for their

conversion. Set the people's hearts aflame through hearing confessions, preaching, devoutly celebrating the Eucharist, visiting families, organizing catechism classes for children etc. I request the Sisters and PPC members will to organize people to greet their parish priests on that day 4th of August or on the nearest Sunday.

- 7. Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord (6th August): This Event is recorded in three of the four canonical Gospels: (Matthew 17:1-8, Mark 9:2-8, and Luke 9:28-36.) signifies Revelation of Jesus' Divine Glory and his true nature as the Son of God, This affirmation from the Father confirmed Jesus' identity as the Son of God, emphasizing his authority and mission as the Savior and Messiah, Foreshadowing of Jesus' Resurrection Moses and Elijah appeared alongside Jesus, symbolizes the continuity of God's plan of salvation throughout history and transformative experience for the three disciples who witnessed it. This experience would later sustain them during the difficult times of Jesus' passion and crucifixion.
- 8. Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary/76th Independence of our Country (15th August): The Whole Church is in praise of the Creator for the Glorious Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Mary was preserved from the stain of sin at her birth and in life she fulfilled her mission faithfully. God was pleased to receive her into Heaven Body and Soul and crown her as Queen of Heaven and Earth. This feast of our Lady makes us aware of the challenges of Christian life and invites us to faithfully carry out God's plan in our life. Let us seek the powerful intercession of our Blessed Mother Mary in our day to day life and remain blessed. We are completing 76 years of Independence of our Nation. We are all proud of this great freedom moment for which thousands of people sacrificed their precious lives. Let us have a meaningful celebration of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into Heaven and the Independence Day.
- 9. Anniversary of the Diocese (18th August): Our Diocese will be completing 18 years on 18th August, the day the diocese was formally inaugurated in the year 2005. The Lord has truly blessed this diocese. Let us all thank God for this and joyously continue to serve this mission diocese and make ever more vibrant. It is also the day of my Episcopal Ordination. I gratefully acknowledge the support and cooperation of yours at all times during the past 18 years. Do pray for me that I may continue to guide and serve this mission diocese like Jesus the Good Shepherd
