Dear Fathers, Sisters and brethren, Happy Easter!

With profound joy and heartfelt gratitude, I extend to each of you my warmest Easter blessings. As we rejoice in the resurrection of our Lord, may I kindly request you to graciously convey my Easter wishes to your parishioners. May the radiant presence of the Risen Lord infuse our lives with boundless joy, enduring peace, and steadfast hope, illuminating our paths as we faithfully fulfill the divine calling to priesthood and consecrated life. Let us, with hearts overflowing with love, continue to embrace and share the transformative power of His resurrection in our daily endeavors.

- **1. House Blessing:** Easter has arrived, and now is the perfect time for house blessings. Visiting the parishioners in their homes during the Easter time, the parish priest represents the Risen Lord meeting his people in the families bringing forgiveness, peace and hope of a new life with the Lord. I request all parish priests and mission directors to arrange house blessings at the earliest convenience, to initiate Family Blessings soon after Easter, and to ensure completion before the conclusion of the Easter Season.
- 2. Divine Mercy Sunday (April 07): The Divine Mercy Feast is a celebration of God's merciful love, as revealed in the Paschal Mystery of Christ's death and resurrection. This feast is celebrated on the Second Sunday of Easter, also known as "Divine Mercy Sunday." The origins of this feast can be traced to the visions and writings of St Faustina Kowalska, a Polish nun who received revelations from Jesus about His divine mercy. The Divine Mercy Feast is a celebration of God's merciful love, as revealed in the Paschal Mystery, and a call for the faithful to embrace and live out this divine mercy in their lives. On this Sunday, encourage people to go to confession, receive Holy Communion, recite of the Divine Mercy Chaplet, venerating the image of the Divine Mercy, symbolizing his mercy and love of God for all people.
- **3. Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord (April 08):** The Solemnity of the Annunciation is celebrated nine months before the Nativity of the Lord. The Annunciation recalls the day when the Archangel Gabriel appeared to Mary and revealed God's will that she become the Mother of the Son of God, and she accepted. This year because it would otherwise fall during Holy Week, the Annunciation will be observed on Monday, April 8. As Mother Mary invited to play a special role in God's plan for salvation surrendered herself to God's plan, let us submit ourselves to her powerful intercession that we may also surrender to God's will in our life.
- **4. Vocation Sunday (April 21):** "Good Shepherd Sunday" also known as "Vocation Sunday" is observed on fourth Sunday of Easter. Vocation Sunday is a time to reflect on the personal call that God has for each person, whether to priesthood, religious life, or

other vocations, and to pray for an increase in vocations to serve the needs of the Church and the world. It is an opportunity to reflect on the Call to Priesthood and Religious life and praying for those who are discerning their vocations. Please promote vocations in our families and Parish/Mission Centre by meeting children and their parents and prepare to send aspirants to the Apostolic School.

## 'Vocation Camp-2024'

In view of promoting vocations, the Commission for Vocation and Formation is hosting 'Vocation Camp-2024' for boys on **April 7-8** at **Holy Redeemer Church, Bhalki,** begins on **7**<sup>th</sup> **evening at 06.00 PM** and ends on **8**<sup>th</sup> **after lunch.**

- **5. Feast of St Mark the Evangelist (April 25):** St Mark the Evangelist, also known as John Mark, was one of the four Evangelists. He was born in Cyrene, a city in North Africa, of Jewish descent. St Mark accompanied St Paul and St Barnabas on their first missionary journey, but he later returned to Jerusalem. He also travelled with St Peter as his interpreter. Mark wrote his Gospel in Rome around 70 AD. The Gospel of Mark is the shortest of the four Gospels and focuses on the actions and deeds of Jesus rather than his teachings. Mark is also credited with founding the church in Alexandria, Egypt, and is venerated as the patron saint of that city.
- **6. Faith Formation Camp:** I hope by now you have received the lessons and teaching material for the Faith Formation Camp prepared by the Commission for the Catechetics. Once again I remind you that these lessons provide you with only the required basic material. The teacher must study them, take pain to prepare the lessons suitable to the class one is teaching by adding his or her faith-experience. You can enrich the lesson by giving better examples, adding appropriate songs, action songs, dramatization etc. Make your lessons more and more experiential and let it be a joyful faith experience for our children receiving the knowledge of faith, values and convictions.
- 7. Election and Formation of the New Pastoral Councils: As the term of the present Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) is getting over we announce to you the election process for the new PPC. Let us take all possible care to see that our people elect enthusiastic and selfless members to the new PPC, people who can work with us to implement the DPP by actively involving themselves into at least one or two Commissions. We will send to you the copies of the PPC Constitution. Follow the proper procedures in the election process and send the names of the elected members in all the villages and wards, and also the list of PPC members (elected + nominated) for the approval. We are sending you the schedule of the election of pastoral structures.

- **8. SANKALPA-2024:** is scheduled from **April 11<sup>th</sup> to April 30<sup>th</sup>** (*Please note the correction to last month's circular no: 225*) for current 7<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup>, and 9<sup>th</sup> grade students at Sugyan, Diocesan Pastoral Centre. Mission Directors/Parish Priests are requested to encourage only eligible and interested children for the program and to get the maximum benefit. There would be an entrance exam during the Faith formation Camp.
- **9. PRERANA Camp:** You are welcome to hold *Prerana* Camp between April 14<sup>th</sup> to May 10<sup>th</sup> for all the children from 1<sup>st</sup> to 9<sup>th</sup> Standard desiring to study especially those deprived of good education in the villages. The afternoon time can be utilized to help children to know their talents organizing various faith formation and cultural activities. Let there be Prayer, *Bhajans*, Mass and Rosary every day. Please engage good teachers and able Camp Masters. Also, please get the budget approved before you begin the camp.
- **10. Summer Ministry for Brothers:** Welcome to our Brothers studying in major seminaries in Mangalore and Bangalore who have come for their summer ministry.
- **11. New Translation of Kannada New Testament:** I'm pleased to inform you that the KRCBC and Bible Society will be launching a new translation of the Kannada New Testament on April 24<sup>th</sup>. I request you to encourage your parishioners to read and engage with this new translation, which promises to offer fresh insights and understanding of the Scriptures in Kannada.
- 12. Election 2024: As you may already know, the elections have been announced, presenting an opportunity for every eligible individual to make their voice heard. Voting is not just a right but a responsibility that shapes the future of our nation. Therefore, I urge you to encourage all our faithful who are eligible to cast their votes in the upcoming election. Make an announcement to bring awareness among our people and urge them to set aside their other commitments and prioritize this fundamental responsibility. You are welcome to organise an Easter get-together to make it an occasion to speak about this. On Election Day, request youth, PPC and catholic association members to help out senior citizens and disabled ones by taking them to the polling booth.
- **13. Vacation:** I request all the priests who are planning to go for vacations, to make proper arrangements before your departure. You are kindly reminded not to leave the parish without ensuring that appropriate arrangements are in place to meet the pastoral needs of your parish/mission in your absence. This includes scheduling Masses, sacraments, and any other essential pastoral duties. We appreciate your understanding and cooperation in ensuring the smooth functioning of your parish in your absence. Wishing you safe travels and happiness during your vacation.
- 14. ADMISSION TO SCHOOLS AND HOSTELS: Let us be concerned about the Education of the poor catholic children in the villages who do not have access to good Catholic education. Kindly motivate all the parents to admit the children to Catholic schools and hostels that they may be brought up in Catholic faith. After proper scrutiny, issue a proper recommendation letter to the HMs and Hostel Managers mentioning the amount the parents agree to pay at the time of admission. Let us take care that our children are admitted to hostels before 31st May, so that the remaining seats can be allotted to other Christians seeking admission in our schools. If your students (VIII X, PUC, Degree, ITI, Deploma, Nursing and B.Ed) need GDES support, make the student write an application and forward them to the Secretary, GDES, before 15th July with your recommendation. Encourage youth to go for professional and skill trainings (ITI, Diploma, B. Sc, B. Com, B. Pharmacy, Nursing etc). Hereafter we may not be helping the youth who seek only a degree that makes them only non employable.

As per the Education Policy of the Church in India, catholic children shall not be denied admission in any of our schools. While admitting children to schools for 1st Standard, please motivate the parents to trust in God and admit them as Christians so that they can avail Christian minority scholarships.

After careful consideration to ensure the continued smooth functioning of our institutions and to provide the best possible facilities and services to our students the hostel fee has been raised to Rs. 12,000/-.

Please note, only 50% concession of school and hostel fees (and no further concession) is to be given for the needy, the daily wage earners (Coolie workers). This policy of concession to poor Catholic children must be observed by all - the Diocesan and Religious Institutions. I request all those who run the Study Homes to employ a good warden/teacher to take care of the children. Make it mandatory for Children/Students who seek financial help in our institutions to submit written applications.

15. Annual Catechism Exam Result: The results for the Diocesan Level Annual Catechism Exams for 7th and 10th standard students are now out. We congratulate all the students for their performance and dedication throughout the examination. We also express our sincere gratitude to the parish priests, mission directors and all the Catechism teachers for their commitment and guidance. Special thanks to Rev. Fr Deepak Furtado, Secretary, Commission for Catechetics, for his dedicated and tireless efforts in conducting the exam. 

## News March 2024

**Retreat by Lay Evangelizers (March 02):** On March 2<sup>nd</sup>, lay evangelizers gathered for a retreat at *Kristashrama* Kowdiyal, immersing themselves in spiritual activities and discussions.
