Holy Father's Intention for the Month: For formation in discernment: Let us pray that we might again learn how to discern, to know how to choose paths of life and reject everything that leads us away from Christ and the Gospel.

Dear Fathers, Sisters and Brethren, Jai Christ!

Thanks for your participation in the Deanery Zonal Level Programmes of Mission Orientation and Pastoral Planning. You were present in good numbers. All the Directors, except in one place, presented the progress and changes of their mission well. It was amazing to see the enthusiasm of our PPC members. Please include them in your PPP – Parish Pastoral Plan. I hope, by now, you are ready with your Action Plans for the Year 2025-26. Please send us a copy at your earliest for our records.

**Family Prayer**: As you are aware, as most of our families do not have daily family prayer, make it a point to introduce 'Family prayer' in every family during your regular family visits. Directors / Parish Priest, please ensure daily family prayer in all families entrusted in your care.

Finally, hold monthly Team Meetings regularly every month. Evaluate the past month's activity and plan for the next month. Well begun is half done, they say. We've begun the Year well. Let's continue in the same spirit till the end. Let our aim be only to become a Synodal Church – of Communion, Participation and Mission.

### 5. Solemnities and Feasts:

Solemnity of the St. Thomas the Apostle of India (July 3): St. Thomas, one of the twelve apostles of Jesus Christ, came to India in 52 A.D., and landed at Kodungallur on the Malabar (presently Kerala) coast. He was martyred in 72 A.D. His tomb is venerated until this day. It is St. Thomas who upon seeing the risen Christ makes that historical confession as, "My Lord and my God!". His sudden realization of truth made Thomas the first person to explicitly acknowledge Jesus' divinity. St. Thomas journey of faith, his missionary zeal which lead him to preach the Gospel in India, and his martyrdom calls each one of us as we work in different mission and ministries in our mission diocese and to ask St. Thomas to intercede for us.

Feast of St. Mary Magdalene (July 22): The memorial of Saint Mary Magdalene was elevated to a Feast by Pope Francis during the Jubilee of Mercy to highlight the relevance of this woman who had such a great love for Christ and who was very much loved by Christ.

She faithfully followed Christ after receiving love and forgiveness for her sins without judgment or condemnation. She had the honor of being the prima testis (first witness) of the resurrection of the Lord, the first to see the empty tomb, and the first to hear the truth of his resurrection and the also the first to witness to Christ's resurrection before the apostles. Christ had a special consideration and mercy for this woman who showed such great love toward Him. St. Mary Magdalene is the patron saint of converts, repentant sinners, and pharmacists.

Feast of St. James, the Apostle (July 25): James the Greater, of the sons of Zebedee, as he was known, along with his brother John, were zealous followers of Christ. We read in Acts 12:1-3, Herod Agrippa, who ruled Judea from 41-44, martyred James the Greater as a way of appeasing the Pharisaic Jews who were opposed to Jesus and His followers. The place where St. James is buried is now Santiago (Saint James) of Compostela (field of stars) and has been a major pilgrimage site the Camino de Santiago (Way of Saint James), Spain is a route traveled on foot. As we honor this holy Apostle, ponder his willingness to stand strong in the face of persecution and death. That courage must inspire us to have hope and strength in the face of anything we endure in life.

Memorial of St. Joachim and St. Anne - Parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary (July 26): Today the Church celebrates the parents of the Virgin Mary, the grandparents of Jesus, Saints Joachim and Anne. In their home, Mary came into the world, accompanied by the extraordinary mystery of the Immaculate Conception. Mary grew up in the home of Joachim and Anne; she was surrounded by their love and faith: in their home she learned to listen to the Lord and to follow his will. Saints Joachim and Anne were part of a long chain of people who had transmitted their faith and love for God, expressed in the warmth and love of family life, down to Mary, who received the Son of God in her womb. How precious is the family as the privileged place for transmitting the faith! (Pope Francis) This Feast is also celebrated as the World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly (July 27).

Memorial of St. Alphonsa Muttathupadathu (July 28): St. Alphonsa Muttathupadathu was born in Kudamalur, the Arpookara region, in the diocese of Changanacherry, India, on the 19th of August 1910. From her birth, the life of the Blessed was marked by the cross, which would be progressively revealed to her as the royal way to conform herself to Christ. She joined the convent of the Franciscan Clarists at Bharananganam in 1935 as a novice. Jesus, however, wished to lead His spouse to perfection through a life of suffering, even her final year of life was a continuous agony with the discovery of a tumor which had spread throughout her organs. Through it all she entrusted herself to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, gladly undergoing it all for His sake. She entered into her heavenly abode finally joined eternally to Christ on 28th July 1946.

Memorial of St. Ignatius of Loyola (July 30): Ignatius from Loyola, Spain, began his adult life as a knight and soldier where he learned many sins, gambling, fighting, treachery, and womanizing. At a battle his leg was injured. It was during the period of convalescence that he experienced a radical conversion to Christ. He documented his spiritual progress, eventually publishing his insights in his classic, the Spiritual Exercises. His ideals and creative leadership drew impressive followers, including St. Francis Xavier who came to evangelise India. They founded the Society of Jesus, preeminent Catholic Order of men in the world. It is to be gratefully remembered that the Jesuits saved Europe from

Protestantism, evangelized entire countries by themselves, educated the higher classes of many nations for centuries, and taught a Catholic humanism of the highest caliber.

Santhosh Bapu at Halbarga Mission on June 1<sup>st</sup>. Fr. Salvadore Fernandes and Fr. Satish Kumar OFM Cap, the new Parish Priest, Sisters and faithful of Halbarga Mission were present.
- **2. Mission Orientation Program across Deaneries:** Mission Orientation Programmes were successfully conducted at Kalaburagi, Bidar and Vijayapura Deaneries on June 7, 8 and 15 June 2025 respectively.
